Interim Executive Director's

Message



Greetings from the Trustees and Staff of the MBTA Retirement Fund. Last year, 2023 marked significant and historic milestones for the Fund - one quite old

and the other very new.

MBTA Retirement Fund's 75th Anniversary

First the historic milestone. Although the MBTA Retirement Fund's roots extend back to the turn of the 20th Century when a private company, Boston Elevated, operated masstransportation in Boston, the year 1948 stands as the true birth date of the modern Fund. In that year, Harry Truman was elected President in an upset, the Cleveland Indians beat the

Boston Braves 4 games to 2 in the World Series, and the Metropolitan Transit Authority, precursor to the MBTA, established a trust to hold pension assets and created a contributory retirement plan for the benefit of its members. This means 2023 marked the 75th Anniversary of your pension fund, the MBTARF. In commemoration, Fund Staff and Trustees capped off the final year of a successful four-year Strategic Plan by commissioning an independent assessment of its implementation efforts and immediately began looking toward the future through development of a new Strategic Plan covering 2024-2027.

Implementing New Benefit Structure

The second milestone reached in 2023 was an important operational achievement. Major credit is due to Staff for the Fund's effective implementation of a brand new, Pension Agreement, effective from June 30, 2018, to June 30, 2028. In 2023 Fund Staff successfully issued all retroactive raises, conducted in person educational sessions, and member questions answered all regarding switching to the New Group B Pension structure or remaining in Group A. The new agreement, negotiated by the MBTA and Local 589, is available on the website, www.mbtarf.com.

The Group A Plan membership includes

employees who became Members of the Fund on or before June 30, 2023. These employees are automatically in the Group A Plan unless they elected to join the Group B Plan prior to the election period deadline on March 29, 2024. The Group B Plan membership includes any employees who are or become Members of the Fund on or after July 1, 2023. Members of Group A were able to elect to join Group B Plan by providing written notice to the Fund between June 30, 2023, and March 29, 2024, by completing the election form on the Fund's website. When the election period ended on March 29, 2024, following a three-month extension, 962 Group A Members joined the Group B Plan, and 19 Members revoked their original Group B election and reverted to the Group A Plan. I am proud to say that Fund staff did a magnificent job educating membership and quickly integrating the new two-tier benefit structure, which is described fully in my Milestones newsletter from Spring 2023, into the Fund's benefit administration systems.

Board of Trustees Actions

Fund Trustees have also been quite busy in 2023. A new provision in the Pension Agreement mandates that the Fund will use its best efforts, subject to the Trustees exercising their fiduciary and

investment obligations, to transfer 50% of the market value of its portfolio of assets as of April 30, 2023, which totals \$835 Million, to the Pension Reserves Investment Trust (PRIT). As a result of the changes to the Pension Agreement the Fund undertook an asset liability modeling study (ALM). The study's purpose is to consider alternatives to the current asset mix with the objective of identifying potential opportunities for improved Fund financial results; the Fund's actuary Buck produced the study in November 2023. After the completion of the ALM study the Board chose from six different product mixes to evaluate for the Fund's future asset allocation. On February 16, 2024, the Board approved an updated asset allocation that went into effect on April 1, 2024. The new asset allocation increases exposure to income investments to take advantage of current higher interest rates, while reducing exposure to alternatives



As a result of these changes at the end of the first quarter 2024 the Fund has committed to approximately 40% of the PRIT mandate, \$334 Million with investments in Private Equity, Hedge Funds, Emerging Markets Equity, Core Fixed Income, Value Added Fixed Income, and International Equity.

MBTA Retirement Fund Preliminary 2023 Performance

After a down year in the markets in 2022, 2023 provided a nice bounce back. Especially during the fourth quarter when the portfolio was up 6.64%. The total Fund return gross of fees was 9.40%. The Fund outperformed its' assumed rate of return of 7.25% by 215 basis points but trailed its policy index of 11.02% by 162 basis points. Equities had a strong 2023, generating returns ranging from 18.24% for the EAFE index of non-U.S. developed markets stocks to 26.29% and 16.93% for the S&P 500 Index of Large Cap U.S. stocks and Russell 2000 Index of Small Cap U.S. stocks, respectively. Fixed income was also a positive contributor to 2023 returns, as core bond index returns ranged from 13.45% for the Bloomberg U.S. Corporate High Yield index to 5.53% for the Bloomberg Barclays Aggregate Index. Diversified hedge funds also contributed, reporting a gain of 5.83% for the year based on the CFSB/Tremont Hedge Fund Index. Real estate was an outlier in 2023, as the NECREIF Property Index detracted (7.94%).

Based on preliminary results, the MBTA Retirement Fund portfolio gained 3.2% for the Quarter ended March 31, 2024. The portfolio's first quarter 2024 return exceeded the return of the policy index due to outperformance in the fixed income and risk parity portfolios. Equity markets gained during the first quarter of 2024 amid continued signs of a strong U.S. economy, positive earnings news from technology companies positioned to benefit from advances in artificial intelligence. The S&P 500 index of U.S. large company stocks returned 10.6%, while the Russell 2000 index of U.S. Small Cap stocks and MSCI EAFE index of international stocks continued to generate more modest gains of 5.2% and 5.8%, respectively, a trend that has led to higher valuations in large U.S. company stocks. In the bond market the story was different. The Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate bond index returned (0.8%) over the three-month period as yields, which move inversely to bond prices, rose amid modestly higher than expected inflation reported for January and concern that the Federal Reserve may be less inclined to cut rates, during the first half of 2024. Real estate as measured by the NCREIF ODCE index returned (2.6%) amid continued price deprecation, particularly in the office sector and higher borrowing costs.

Looking forward to the remainder of 2024, with the Fund's added exposure to income investments in the new asset allocation, the Fund should perform well when the Federal Reserve's long awaited interest rate cuts materialize. Until that time arrives the higher allocation to bonds will allow the fund to receive a higher interest rate return from bonds and contribute to the total return of the portfolio.

MBTA Retirement Fund Recommends Considering a Change to Direct Deposit

There are several benefits of direct deposit that benefit a retiree and their access to their money

1. It's Immediate

When you use direct deposit, the money shows up in your account on payday, ready for you to use. That's not possible with a paper check, which you must take to the bank and wait for the money to clear before it's available to use. With direct deposit, your money will be deposited even if your bank is closed.

2. It's Convenient

With direct deposit, trips to the bank are a thing of the past, saving you valuable time. Even better, you don't need to wait for the mail in order to receive a paper check. With direct deposit, you get paid no matter where you are.

3. It's Safe and Secure

Despite how careful you are, there's always the risk of losing, misplacing, or damaging a paper check and needing to wait until the issuer stops payment and issues you a new check. Even worse, your check could be stolen and cashed. While checks require a signature, it's no guarantee against someone else cashing it if a bank teller or check-cashing employee doesn't verify the identity of the person cashing the check. It would take time and effort to prove the theft before you would be able to get paid again.

4. It's Easy to Set Up

Digital or online banking is here to stay, and direct deposit falls within this super convenient way of banking. To get started, and set up a direct deposit, all you need to do is simply fill out a form (available on our website). You will have to provide your name, address, Social Security number, bank routing number, and account number. The bank routing number is the first set of numbers printed on the bottom left of your checks. Your account number is to the right on the bottom of the check.

When to enroll in Medicare Part A and Part B if you have GIC health coverage:

This depends on your employment status with the MBTA

- *If you, the insured, continue working* for the MBTA at age 65 or over, you and your covered spouse should only enroll in free Medicare Part A if eligible. Defer Part B until you, the insured, retire
- *If retiring*, and you or your covered spouse is age 65 or over, the family member(s) age 65 or over should apply for Medicare Part A (premium free) and Part B up to a month before your retirement. You and/or your spouse age 65 or over will receive a Medicare enrollment form from the GIC approximately two to three weeks after the GIC is notified by your GIC Coordinator of your retirement. Be sure to respond to the GIC by the due date noted in the package.

If retired, when you or your covered spouse turns age 65, apply for Medicare Part A (premium free) and Part B up to three months before your 65th birthday. You or your spouse turning age 65 will receive a Medicare enrollment form from the GIC approximately three months before your 65th birthday to make your Medicare health plan selection. Be sure to respond to the GIC by the due date.

Reimbursement of Medicare Part B Premiums

The Transit Fund currently reimburses

you and your spouse's Medicare Part B base premium through the Transit Employees Health and Welfare Fund if you are:

- 1. Retired
- 2. Age 65
- 3. Enrolled and in good standing with the Transit Fund (paying annual dues)
- 4. Enrolled in a GIC Medicare supplement plan with the Transit Authority
- 5. In good standing with your Union

When you or your spouse turn age 65, you will be eligible to enroll in the Medicare B Reimbursement Program through the Transit Employees Health & Welfare Fund. Your reimbursement will be included with your pension payment or you will receive a manual check in the mail each month.

For 2024, all qualified participants and spouses (if enrolled), will be reimbursed the current standard Medicare Part B premium, \$174.70 each month for calendar year 2024 (\$349.40 if you and your Spouse are both enrolled in the Medicare B Reimbursement Program). The standard premium amount is determined by the Social Security Administration each year and will automatically be updated every January. Now is the time to review! Having the correct beneficiary on file can go a long way in preventing benefits being paid to someone else... Sadly, these situations can and do happen. Don't let it happen to your loved ones! Please contact the Retirement Fund to update your beneficiary today.

Tips about Beneficiaries

- If you do not designate a primary beneficiary, the payment may pass to your estate where it could be subject to taxes and fees, or your state law may determine who receives the benefit.
- Be sure to list a secondary or contingent beneficiary in the event your primary beneficiary precedes you in death.

- List the full name of each beneficiary instead of "son," "spouse," "wife," etc. This will avoid complications if the unthinkable occurs.
- If you have more than one primary beneficiary specify the percentage of proceeds each one should receive.
- Make sure the contact information for your beneficiaries is up to date with the MBTA Retirement Fund and if applicable, your Human Resources department or the GIC.
- Consider consulting an advisor (investment professional, accountant, lawyer, etc.) if you have specific questions.
- Retired members are ineligible to make changes to their designated beneficiary.
